




DPS NATIONAL SWIMMING MEET BOYS (OPEN) 2024




TREKKING TO BETTADAPURA HILLS








IISC BANGALORE

INSPIRING YOUNG MINDS: ISRO'S EDUCATIONAL INITIATIVE

Dr. Venkitakrishnan P. V. from ISRO shared his vast experience, recounting the challenges faced by Vikram Sarabhai in establishing ISRO in the 1960s. He emphasized how space research impacts our daily lives, introducing technologies like those behind Google Maps, made possible by ISRO's satellites. He highlighted India's prominent position among the top four countries in space exploration today. Following his talk, Dr. Venkitakrishnan P. This initiative, the first of its kind by ISRO, aimed to foster curiosity and encourage future space exploration careers.

FRENCH DAY





Health Checkup




Workshop-Bouncing Back




Traffic Awareness Program

Exploring the vastness of the ocean We've all talked about or have watched fantasies on TV ever since we were kids, read and heard innumerable stories about The Wizard of Oz, seen Harry Potter, and can't forget Alice In Wonderland.

As we grow older, the fantasies we've always read about become vast and endless. However, have you ever wondered if there was a completely unexplored world, here on Earth, that has billions or maybe even trillions of creatures waiting to be explored and discovered? Well, there is one, and that is the ocean. Being a child that grew up near the Red Sea, I developed a deep connection when it came to the ocean and water bodies. There was always a sense of serenity when I sat on the fine grains of sand and looked at the vast spread of water. It reached out as far as the eyes could see, leaving me with a sense of awe and insignificance.

Only 20% of the ocean has been explored. It is like a whole other world below the water with so many creatures our minds can't comprehend. Atlantis—often regarded as a myth—is an underwater city mentioned in the year 360 BC by a Greek philosopher, Plato. He described it as a prosperous city that existed 9,000 years before his time.



$$F=G*m_1m_2/r^2$$


Newton's theory was one of the widely accepted theory at that time, but then it still had some shortcomings.

Here came Einstein's theory Of General Relativity. According to him space is like a rubber cloth, which can be stretched downwards when an object with mass is put on it.




Einstein's flexible space-time






Unlock Your Leadership Potential
