

## VISIT TO AA PROBICS: EXPLORING THE FRONTIERS OF BIOTECHNOLOGY





# World Environment Day



# AVIATION

Aviation refers to the activity of flying aircraft, or of designing, producing, and keeping them in good condition. Aviation includes the activities surrounding mechanical flight and the aircraft industry. Aircraft include fixed wing and rotary-wing types, morphable wings, wing-less lifting bodies, as well as lighter-than-air aircraft such as hot air balloons and airships. It transforms global travel, trade, and culture by connecting the world through rapid transport, while driving economic growth and supporting crucial services like medical evacuations

Aviation began in the 18th century with the development of the hot air balloon, an apparatus capable of atmospheric displacement through buoyancy. Clément Ader built the Ader Éole; in France and made an uncontrolled, powered hop in 1890. This was the first powered aircraft, although it did not achieve controlled flight. Some of the most significant advancements in aviation technology came with the controlled gliding flying of Otto Lilienthal in 1896. A major leap followed with the construction of the Wright Flyer, the first powered airplane by the Wright brothers in the early 1900s. Since that time, aviation has been technologically revolutionized by the introduction of the jet engine which enabled aviation to become a major form of transport throughout the world. In 2024, there were 9.5 billion passengers worldwide according to the ICAO. As of 2018, estimates suggest that 11% of the world's population travelled by air, with up to 4% taking international flights.

The word aviation was coined by the French writer and former naval officer Gabriel de LaLondelle in 1863. He originally derived the term from the verb avier (an unsuccessful neologism for to fly), itself derived from the Latin word avis (bird) and the suffix -ation.

There are early legends of human flight such as the stories of Icarus in Greek myth, Jamshid and Shah Kay Kāvus in Persian myth, and the flying automaton of Archytas of Tarentum (428–347 BC).

In conclusion, aviation has played a crucial role in shaping the modern world. From early myths and balloon flights to advanced jet aircraft and global air travel, aviation has continuously evolved through innovation and scientific discovery. It has transformed transportation by connecting countries and cultures, supporting economic development, and providing essential services such as medical aid and disaster response. As technology continues to advance, aviation is expected to become even more efficient and sustainable ensuring that it remains an essential part of human progress and global connectivity.

Imagine tossing a stone into a still pond. The water ripples spread outward in circles. Now picture something similar—but instead of water, the ripples move through space and time itself. That's what gravitational waves are.

### So, What Are Gravitational Waves?

Gravitational waves are tiny vibrations in space caused by incredibly powerful events in the universe. They happen when massive objects—like black holes or neutron stars—move rapidly or smash into each other. When this happens, space itself gets shaken, sending waves racing across the universe at the speed of light.

### Where Do They Come From?

These waves are born during some of the most dramatic moments in space, such as:

- Two black holes colliding
- Two neutron stars crashing together
- A massive star exploding in a supernova

These events release mind-blowing amounts of energy—enough to stretch and squeeze space as the waves pass by.

## How Do Scientists Detect Them?

Gravitational waves are incredibly small, which makes them very hard to detect. To find them, scientists use ultra-precise instruments called detectors. One of the most famous is LIGO (Laser Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory).

LIGO uses lasers to measure tiny changes in distance—changes smaller than the width of an atom! When a gravitational wave passes through Earth, it slightly alters the detector's length, and scientists can spot that tiny shift.

### Why Do Gravitational Waves Matter?

Gravitational waves give scientists a whole new way to explore the universe.

They help us:

- Study black holes, which we can't see with regular telescopes
- Learn how stars are born, live, and die
- Understand how the universe began and how it continues to evolve

It's like switching from only looking at the universe to actually listening to it.





He took lord Rama to the underworld and made a spell and put him in a very deep sleep, this spell could be only broken if all the five mystical lamps were extinguished at once.**

**Despite Hanuman's vigilant guard over Lord Rama and Lakshmana, Ahiravana used his mastery of illusion to disguise himself as Vibhishana and abduct the brothers to his underworld kingdom. Hanuman immediately descended to Patala Loka to rescue them. There, he learned that Ahiravana's life was tied to five mystical lamps (or bees in some versions) that were lit in five different directions. The demon could only be defeated if all five lamps were extinguished simultaneously.**

To accomplish this, Hanuman manifested his Panchamukhi form, featuring five distinct faces:

- **Sri Hanuman (East):** His original face, representing purity and the removal of sins.
- **Sri Narasimha (South):** A lion's face, providing victory over enemies and the removal of fear.
- **Sri Garuda (West):** An eagle's face, which wards off black magic and evil spirits.
- **Sri Varaha (North):** A boar's face, granting prosperity and liberation from planetary troubles.
- **Sri Hayagriva (Skyward):** A horse's face, bestowing knowledge and spiritual wisdom.

By blowing in all five directions at once, Hanuman extinguished the lamps, instantly ending Ahiravana's life and safely returning Rama and Lakshmana to the battlefield. Today, this form is worshipped as a symbol of all-encompassing protection.


## नदी

ಕರ್ನಾಟಕದ ಸಾಂಸ್ಕೃತಿಕ ರಾಜಧಾನಿ ಮೈಸೂರು ಎಂದರೆ ನಮಗೆ ಮೊದಲು ನೆನಪಾಗುವುದು ಭವ್ಯ ಅರಮನೆ ಮತ್ತು ದಸರಾ ವೈಭವ. ಆದರೆ, ಈ ಪರಂಪರೆಯ ಆಚೆಗೂ ಮೈಸೂರು ಜಗತ್ತೇ ಬೆರಗಾಗುವಂತಹ ಹತ್ತಾರು ವೈಜ್ಞಾನಿಕ ಮತ್ತು ಕೈಗಾರಿಕಾ ಆವಿಷ್ಕಾರಗಳ ತವರೂರು. ಭಾರತದ ಪ್ರಜಾಪ್ರಭುತ್ವವನ್ನು ಭದ್ರಪಡಿಸುವ ಚುನಾವಣಾ ಶಾಯಿಯಿಂದ ಹಿಡಿದು, ಆಧುನಿಕ ರಕ್ಷಣಾ ತಂತ್ರಜ್ಞಾನಕ್ಕೆ ಬುನಾದಿಯಾದ ರಾಕೆಟ್‌ಗಳವರೆಗೆ ಮೈಸೂರು ಹೊಂದಿರುವ 'ಎಕ್ಸ್‌ಕ್ಯೂಸಿವ್' ದಾಖಲೆಗಳು ಇಲ್ಲಿವೆ.

ಭಾರತದಲ್ಲಿ ಚುನಾವಣೆ ನಡೆದಾಗ ಮತದಾರರ ಬೆರಳಿಗೆ ಹಚ್ಚುವ ಅಳಿಸಲಾಗದ ಶಾಯಿಯನ್ನು ತಯಾರಿಸುವ ಏಕೈಕ ಸಂಸ್ಥೆ ಮೈಸೂರಿನ 'ಮೈಸೂರು ಪೇಂಟ್ಸ್ ಅಂಡ್ ವಾರ್ನಿಷ್ ಲಿಮಿಟೆಡ್' (MPVL). 1962 ರಿಂದ ಇಂದಿನವರೆಗೂ ಈ ಶಾಯಿಯ ರಹಸ್ಯ ಸೂತ್ರವನ್ನು ಯಾರಿಗೂ ಬಿಟ್ಟುಕೊಡದೆ, ಭಾರತ ಸೇರಿದಂತೆ ವಿಶ್ವದ 30ಕ್ಕೂ ಹೆಚ್ಚು ದೇಶಗಳಿಗೆ ಇಲ್ಲಿಂದಲೇ ಶಾಯಿ ರಫ್ತಾಗುತ್ತದೆ.

### 2. ನೋಟು ಮುದ್ರಣದ ಏಕಸ್ವಾಮ್ಯ: ನೋಟು ಶಾಯಿ ಮತ್ತು ಕಾಗದ (Currency Secrets)

ಕೇವಲ ಮತದಾನದ ಶಾಯಿಯಲ್ಲ, ಭಾರತೀಯ ಕರೆನ್ಸಿ ನೋಟುಗಳ ಮುದ್ರಣದಲ್ಲೂ ಮೈಸೂರು ಮಹತ್ವದ ಪಾತ್ರ ವಹಿಸಿದೆ. ಮೈಸೂರಿನಲ್ಲಿರುವ 'ವರ್ನಿಕಾ' (Varnika) ಎಂಬ ಘಟಕವು ಭಾರತೀಯ ನೋಟುಗಳಿಗೆ ಬೇಕಾದ ವಿಶೇಷ ಭದ್ರತಾ ಶಾಯಿಯನ್ನು (Security Ink) ಸಂಪೂರ್ಣವಾಗಿ ಸ್ವದೇಶೀಯವಾಗಿ ತಯಾರಿಸುತ್ತದೆ. ಅಲ್ಲದೆ, ನೋಟು ಮುದ್ರಣಕ್ಕೆ ಬೇಕಾದ ವಿಶೇಷ ಕಾಗದವನ್ನು (Bank Note Paper) ತಯಾರಿಸುವ ಬ್ಯುಹತ್ ಮಿಲ್ ಕೂಡ ಇಲ್ಲಿದೆ, ಇದು ಭಾರತವನ್ನು ಈ ಕ್ಷೇತ್ರದಲ್ಲಿ ಸ್ವಾವಲಂಬಿಯನ್ನಾಗಿಸಿದೆ.

### 3. ವಿಶ್ವದ ಮೊದಲ ಕಬ್ಬಿಣದ ರಾಕೆಟ್‌ಗಳು

18ನೇ ಶತಮಾನದಲ್ಲಿಯೇ ಟಿಪ್ಪು ಸುಲ್ತಾನ್ ಮತ್ತು ಹೈದರ್ ಅಲಿ ಕಬ್ಬಿಣದ ನಳಿಕೆಗಳನ್ನು ಬಳಸಿದ ರಾಕೆಟ್‌ಗಳನ್ನು ಅಭಿವೃದ್ಧಿಪಡಿಸಿದ್ದರು. ಬ್ರಿಟಿಷರನ್ನೇ ಬೆಚ್ಚಿಬೀಳಿಸಿದ ಈ ತಂತ್ರಜ್ಞಾನವೇ ಮುಂದೆ ಆಧುನಿಕ ರಾಕೆಟ್ ವಿಜ್ಞಾನಕ್ಕೆ ಬುನಾದಿಯಾಯಿತು. ನಾಸಾ (NASA) ಕೂಡ ಈ ಮೈಸೂರು ರಾಕೆಟ್‌ಗಳನ್ನು ವಿಶ್ವದ ಮೊದಲ ಯುದ್ಧೋಪಯೋಗಿ ರಾಕೆಟ್‌ಗಳೆಂದು ಗುರುತಿಸಿದೆ.

### 4. ಗಂಧದ ಎಣ್ಣೆಯ ವಿಶ್ವಾಧಿನಾಯಕ

ವಿಶ್ವದಲ್ಲೇ ಅತ್ಯುತ್ತಮ ಗುಣಮಟ್ಟದ ಗಂಧದ ಎಣ್ಣೆಯನ್ನು ತಯಾರಿಸುವ 'ಸರ್ಕಾರಿ ಗಂಧದ ಎಣ್ಣೆ ಕಾರ್ಖಾನೆ' (ಈಗಿನ KSDL) 1917ರಲ್ಲಿ ಮೈಸೂರಿನಲ್ಲಿ ಸ್ಥಾಪನೆಯಾಯಿತು. ಮೊದಲ ಮಹಾಯುದ್ಧದ ಸಮಯದಲ್ಲಿ ಗಂಧದ ಮರಗಳು ರಫ್ತಾಗದೆ ಉಳಿದಾಗ, ನಾಲ್ವಡಿ ಕೃಷ್ಣರಾಜ ಒಡೆಯರ್ ಈ ಕಾರ್ಖಾನೆಯನ್ನು ಆರಂಭಿಸಿ ಮೈಸೂರನ್ನು 'ಗಂಧದ ನಗರಿ'ಯನ್ನಾಗಿಸಿದರು.

### 5. ಭಾರತದ ಮೊದಲ ಖಾಸಗಿ ರೇಡಿಯೋ: ಆಕಾಶವಾಣಿ

1935ರಲ್ಲಿ ಪ್ರೊ. ಎಂ.ವಿ. ಗೋಪಾಲಸ್ವಾಮಿ ಅವರು ಮೈಸೂರಿನ ತಮ್ಮ ಮನೆಯಲ್ಲೇ ಭಾರತದ ಮೊದಲ ಖಾಸಗಿ ರೇಡಿಯೋ ಕೇಂದ್ರವನ್ನು ಆರಂಭಿಸಿದರು. ಅವರೇ ಇದಕ್ಕೆ 'ಆಕಾಶವಾಣಿ' ಎಂದು ಹೆಸರಿಟ್ಟರು. ಮುಂದೆ ಇದು ಭಾರತದ ಅಧಿಕೃತ ರೇಡಿಯೋ ಪ್ರಸಾರ ಸಂಸ್ಥೆಯ ಹೆಸರಾಯಿತು.

### 6. ಮೊದಲ ಭೂಗತ ಒಳಚರಂಡಿ ವ್ಯವಸ್ಥೆ

ಭಾರತದ ಬಹುತೇಕ ನಗರಗಳು ಒಳಚರಂಡಿ ವ್ಯವಸ್ಥೆಯ ಬಗ್ಗೆ ಯೋಚಿಸುವ ಮೊದಲೇ, ಅಂದರೆ 1900ರ ಆರಂಭದಲ್ಲೇ ಮೈಸೂರು ಅರಮನೆ ಮತ್ತು ಸುತ್ತಮುತ್ತಲಿನ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಅತ್ಯಾಧುನಿಕ ಭೂಗತ ಒಳಚರಂಡಿ ವ್ಯವಸ್ಥೆಯನ್ನು ಜಾರಿಗೆ ತರಲಾಗಿತ್ತು. ಇದು ಅಂದಿನ ರಾಜರ ನೈರ್ಮಲ್ಯ ಪ್ರಜ್ಞೆಗೆ ಸಾಕ್ಷಿ.

## 7. ಏಷ್ಯಾದ ಮೊದಲ ಯೋಜಿತ ನಗರ

1903ರಲ್ಲಿ 'ಸಿಟಿ ಇಂಪ್ರೋವ್‌ಮೆಂಟ್ ಟ್ರಸ್ಟ್ ಬೋರ್ಡ್' (CITB) ಸ್ಥಾಪಿಸುವ ಮೂಲಕ ಏಷ್ಯಾದಲ್ಲೇ ಅತ್ಯಂತ ವ್ಯವಸ್ಥಿತವಾಗಿ ಯೋಜಿತಗೊಂಡ ನಗರಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಮೈಸೂರು ಒಂದಾಯಿತು. ಇಂದಿಗೂ ಮೈಸೂರಿನ ಅಗಲವಾದ ರಸ್ತೆಗಳು ಮತ್ತು ಪಾರ್ಕಿಂಗ್‌ಗಳು ಈ ಯೋಜಿತ ಸೌಂದರ್ಯವನ್ನು ಕಾಪಾಡಿಕೊಂಡಿವೆ.

## 8. ತಾಳೆಗರಿಗಳ ಅಪರೂಪದ ಭಂಡಾರ

ಮೈಸೂರಿನ 'ಓರಿಯಂಟಲ್ ರಿಸರ್ಚ್ ಇನ್ಸ್ಟಿಟ್ಯೂಟ್' (ORI) ನಲ್ಲಿ ಸುಮಾರು 50,000ಕ್ಕೂ ಹೆಚ್ಚು ಪುರಾತನ ತಾಳೆಗರಿ ಹಸ್ತಪ್ರತಿಗಳಿವೆ. ಕೌಟಿಲ್ಯನ 'ಅರ್ಥಶಾಸ್ತ್ರ'ದ ಹಸ್ತಪ್ರತಿ ಜಗತ್ತಿಗೆ ಮೊದಲ ಬಾರಿಗೆ ಪತ್ತೆಯಾಗಿದ್ದು ಇಲ್ಲೇ ಎಂಬುದು ಐತಿಹಾಸಿಕ ಹೆಮ್ಮೆ.

## 9. ವೈ-ಫೈ ಸೌಲಭ್ಯ ಪಡೆದ ಮೊದಲ ನಗರ

ತಂತ್ರಜ್ಞಾನದ ಅಳವಡಿಕೆಯಲ್ಲಿ ಮೈಸೂರು ಎಂದಿಗೂ ಮುಂಚೂಣಿಯಲ್ಲಿದೆ. 2010ರಲ್ಲಿ ಭಾರತದಲ್ಲೇ ಮೊದಲ ಬಾರಿಗೆ ಇಡೀ ನಗರಕ್ಕೆ ವೈ-ಫೈ ಸೌಲಭ್ಯವನ್ನು ಕಲ್ಪಿಸಿದ ಕೀರ್ತಿ ಮೈಸೂರಿಗೆ ಸಲ್ಲುತ್ತದೆ.

## 10. ರೇಷ್ಮೆ ಮಗ್ಗಗಳ ತಾಂತ್ರಿಕ ಕ್ರಾಂತಿ

1912ರಲ್ಲಿ ಸ್ವಿಟ್ಜರ್‌ಲ್ಯಾಂಡ್‌ನಿಂದ ಭಾರತಕ್ಕೆ ಮೊದಲ ಬಾರಿಗೆ ಅತ್ಯಾಧುನಿಕ ಜಕ್ವಾರ್ಡ್ ಮಗ್ಗಗಳನ್ನು (Swiss Looms) ತಂದದ್ದು ಮೈಸೂರು ಸಿಲ್ಕ್ ಕಾರ್ಖಾನೆಗೆ. ಇಂದಿಗೂ ಆ ಶುದ್ಧ ರೇಷ್ಮೆ ಮತ್ತು ಅಪ್ಪಟ ಚಿನ್ನದ ಜರಿಯ ಸೀರೆಗಳು ಮೈಸೂರಿನ ಎಕ್ಸ್‌ಕ್ಯೂಸಿವ್ ಗುರುತು.
